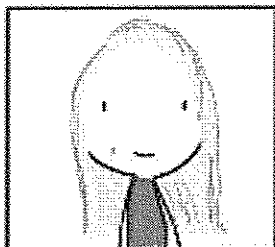


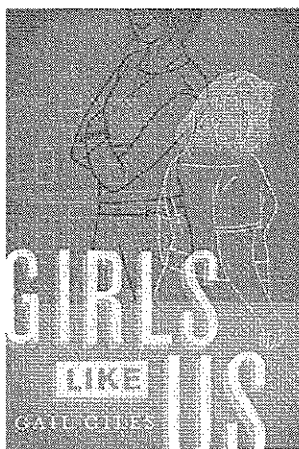
Book Lists

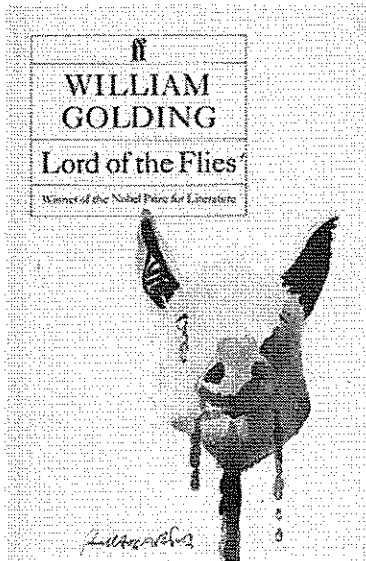


Girls Like Us

DIY THEME: Surviving in the wilderness

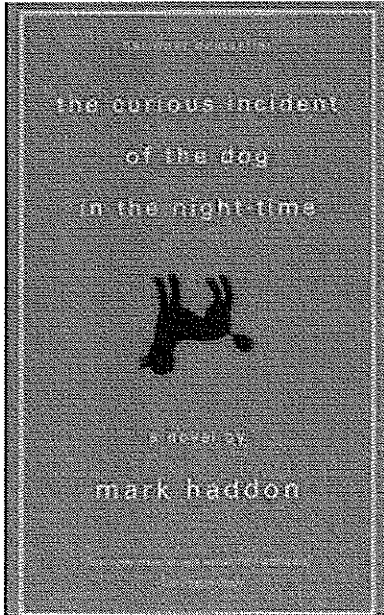

DIY THEME: Adventuring at midnight

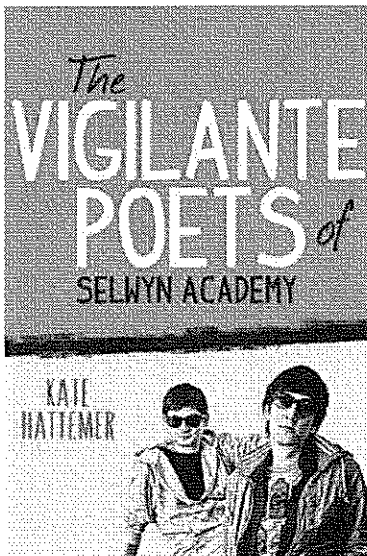

DIY THEME: Investigating a murder

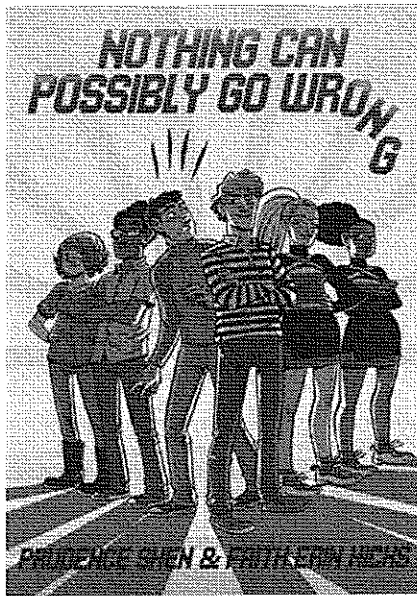

DIY THEME: Saving the day

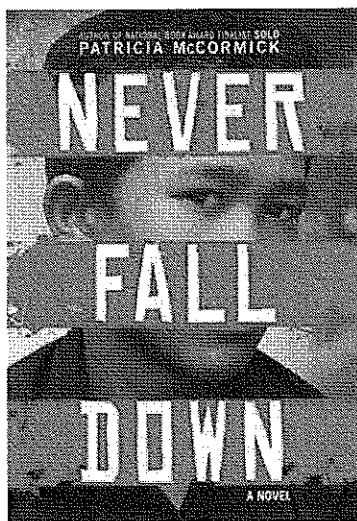
The students of art school Selwyn Academy are being filmed as part of a television show. Ethan takes it upon himself to save the school from the corruption of reality TV.

DIY THEME: Fundraising

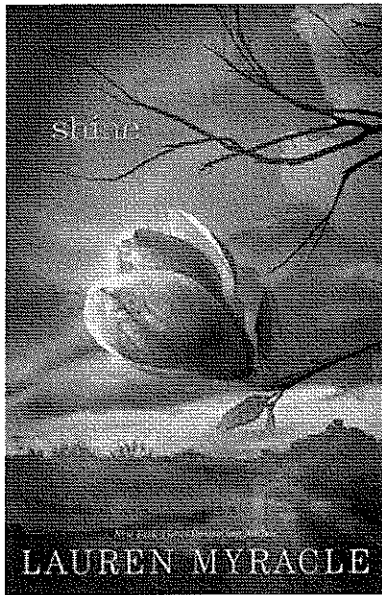

DIY THEME: Learning a musical instrument and living off your wits

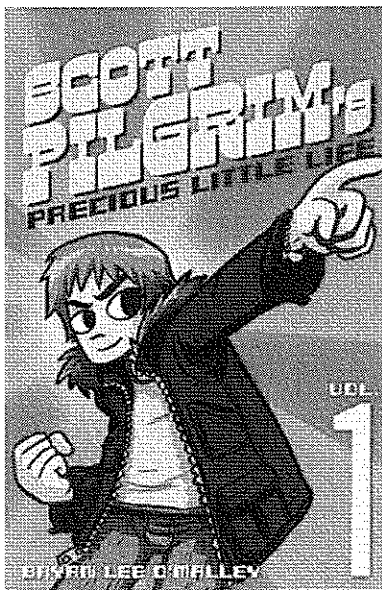

DIY THEME: Avenging your best friend

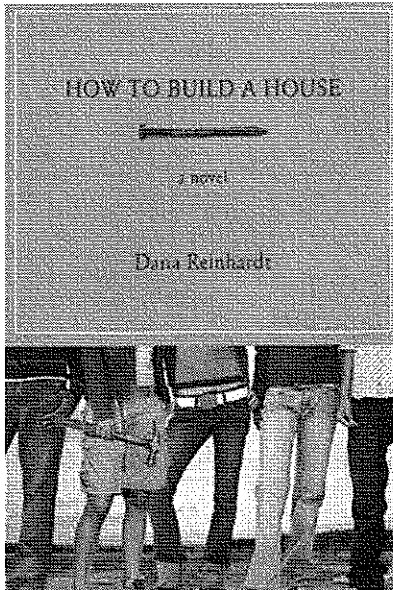
