this book follows a bruja


named Alex, a magical

5. Six of Crows by Leigh Bardugo (GBQ)




Set in a fantasy world called Ketterdam, queer sexuality "fits seamlessly" (Aderhold, 2018) into

6. Every Heart is a Doorway by Seanan McGuire (LTA)




Book 1 in the *Wayward Children* series, this
