TYPES OF APOCALYPSES

In apocalyptic fiction the world is in the process of ending, in post-apocalyptic fiction, the world has already ended and what is left of humanity is trying to survive and often rebuild (Seisser, 2014). Within these genres, the world-ending apocalypses take many different forms the most common of which include those outlined below.



PANDEMICS/VIRAL OUTBREAKS

This form of apocalypse typically involves a highly contagious pathogen/disease wreaking havoc on humanity.

ZOMBIES

This form of apocalypse is often connected to pandemics and outbreaks as it typically involves the outbreak of a disease or pathogen that leads to either the dead coming to life or the living turning into mindless monsters.

ENVIRONMENTAL

This form of apocalypse occurs when climate change or natural disasters either make the planet inhospitable to human life or bring about societal collapse.

Nuclear

This form of apocalypse arises when nuclear warfare or any other type of nuclear breakdown renders the planet largely inhabitable due to high levels of radiation.

extra-terrestrial

This form of apocalypse arises when a threat from space threatens the life of humans on earth. This threat can take many forms from asteroids, gamma radiation, and solar flares to life from other planets invading earth.

TECHNOLOGICAL

This form of apocalypse is typically one of two extremes. Either AI and other manmade technology becomes sentient and turns against humanity or the sudden loss of technology causes humans to turn on each other.
