Video producers have given Hokusai's sketches their final resting place in vibrant dance. The ancient figures caught in leaps and stretches, donned wing sleeves and bowl hats

that cover their faces in every squat and pose. Later, cheeks beaming, fans in hand, they flutter to drumbeats and flutes, but those are creatures of theatre—the compassed land
